About NATPAC



The National Transportation Planning and Research Centre (NATPAC), established in 1976 by the Government of Kerala, is a premier institution dedicated to addressing transportation challenges through research, innovation and policy support.



Reconstituted as an autonomous R&D centre in 1982, NATPAC has been functioning under the Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE) since 2002, aligning its activities with the State's broader science and technology initiatives.



Over the past five decades, NATPAC has played a pivotal role in shaping Kerala's transport landscape, contributing to major initiatives in highway development, urban mobility, water transport, traffic safety and infrastructure planning. The institution's efforts have significantly influenced policy decisions and participation in nationally significant projects.

Conference Overview

Organised as part of the Golden Jubilee celebrations of KSCSTE-NATPAC, the conference reflects the institute's commitment to research excellence, policy support and innovation.

TRANSFORM 2026 serves as a multidisciplinary platform that brings together researchers, policymakers, practitioners, industry leaders, academicians and international experts. It aims to foster dialogue on key transportation challenges, with a strong emphasis on sustainability, safety, resilience and technological integration, while promoting collaboration across sectors to generate actionable and policy-relevant insights. A key objective of the conference is to bridge the gap between research and practice by encouraging contributions that highlight applied methodologies, case studies and implementation-driven solutions. Emphasis is placed on approaches that are scalable, context-sensitive and capable of delivering tangible outcomes.

The conference covers a broad and integrated spectrum of topics, including transportation planning and operations, traffic engineering and safety, infrastructure systems, water-based transport and emerging mobility technologies. It also incorporates critical cross-cutting dimensions such as multimodal integration, transport economics and policy, logistics, climate resilience, environmental sustainability, social equity, gender inclusivity, energy efficiency and public health, ensuring a holistic perspective on mobility systems. Special attention is given to addressing regional transportation challenges within a global context. In regions like Kerala, characterised by high density, mixed traffic conditions, and climate vulnerabilities, the conference facilitates the adaptation of global best practices to local needs, enabling the development of practical and innovative solutions. *The conference themes address the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 3, 5, 7, 9, 10, 11 and 13.* Overall, TRANSFORM 2026 aims to support informed decision-making and contribute to the development of efficient, inclusive, safe, and sustainable transportation systems through a strong integration of research, policy and practice.

Full Paper Submission: Authors are encouraged to submit original, unpublished full-length papers that clearly present the research objectives, methodology, analysis, results and key contributions.

Submission Process: All submitted full papers will undergo an initial screening followed by a rigorous peer-review process to assess their quality, originality and relevance to the conference themes. Accepted papers will be included in Scopus-indexed conference proceedings. Selected high-quality papers may also be considered for possible journal publication.

Industry Track-Extended Abstract Submission: Industry professionals may submit extended abstracts highlighting practical applications, case studies and innovations. The Lead and Corresponding Author for this track must be from the industry.

Authors are required to follow the prescribed formatting guidelines and submission instructions as provided on the conference website.
